Craig S. Harwood Author, Quest for Flight: John J. Montgomery and the Dawn of Aviation in the West



As the gilded age drew to a close in 19th-century America, a lone inventor based on the west coast, John Montgomery, worked against seemingly insurmountable odds to solve one of the great scientific challenges of the ages – the "impossible art" of aerial navigation. *Quest for Flight*, an award-winning book, serves as the basis for an entertaining talk by author Craig S. Harwood, the great-grandnephew of Montgomery. Join him as he weaves the fascinating story of how Montgomery and a handful of his Californian peers collectively transformed science fiction into reality, impacted societal attitudes toward this visionary science and inspired a generation of Americans to take to the skies. *Quest for Flight* establishes, for the first time in the literature, a basis for understanding the foundation upon which California's burgeoning aviation industry of the 1920's and 1930's was formed.

CRAIG S. HARWOOD is a native Californian living in Santa Cruz County, an engineering geologist by profession with 25 years of practice, a technical writer and author of the multi-award winning and nominated book *Quest for Flight*. He is the great-great-grandson of a prominent Californian (Zachariah Montgomery) and therefore the great-grandnephew of American aviation pioneer John J. Montgomery. *Quest for Flight* is currently in nomination for the AIAA's Gardner-Lasser Aviation History Literature Award.
